Licensees filed timely appeals. The cases involve the same attorney, same ALJ, and the same argument as in the past 23 similar cases. In both cases, and for the same reasons as provided in the prior 23 cases, Chief Counsel recommends affirming the ALJ's decision. Member Negra asked if any of the licenses were grandfathered, Attorney Fox replied none were grandfathered.
