Board Member Negra requested that Tisha Albert, Director of Regulatory Affairs, discuss this agenda item involving multiple licensed locations of CHR Corp. (aka "Rutters"). Director Albert explained that Rutters had requested to store and sell a variety of cannabidiol ("CBD") products (e.g., oils, gummies, and lotions, but not any CBD-infused alcohol) on licensed premises.

Director Albert further advised that if approval is granted to Rutters for the sale of twenty-six specific CBD products, the Board might also consider granting approval to other licensees for the storage and sale of the same specific products.

The list of Rutters licenses involved in this request and the list of twenty-six specific CBD products for which selling authority is requested is attached to these meeting minutes as Exhibit A.

Board Member Negra made a motion to approve the request from Rutters to sell the CBD products on licensed premises and stated that he would make an additional motion to approve the sale of specific CBD products by all licensees.

Board Member Isenhour confirmed that Board Member Negra's initial motion was specific to Rutters and both she and Chairman Holden subsequently indicated that they would approve this motion.

Board Member Negra then formally made a motion to approve the sale of the aforementioned products by all licensees on licensed premises as set forth in the request from Rutters.

Chief Counsel Diaz inquired as to whether or not Board Member Negra intended for his second motion to be relevant to distributors and manufacturers in addition to retail licensees. Board Member Negra affirmed that the motion would apply to any entity holding a license issued by the agency. He asked Chief Counsel Diaz to confirm that distributors and importing distributors would potentially be able to sell the products in question, and Chief Counsel Diaz stated that a decision per Board Member Negra's second motion would encompass distributors, importing distributors, manufacturers, and retail licensees.

Chairman Holden requested that further Board action be held since he had been under the impression that an additional motion related to this agenda item would apply solely to retail licensees. Board Member Isenhour seconded Chairman Holden's motion.

This platform provides additional security, system monitoring and resource scalability. Work includes production issue support, functional changes requested by the business and other commerce related updates that will be occurring during this timeframe.

Procured via DGS Contract #4400014600 – VENDOR: **OST, Inc.** – TERM: Six months for period 7/1/2021 through 12/31/2021 - \$68,755.51 estimated cost.

(4) WebSphere Commerce Administrator Staff Augmentation - This resource supports the current WebSphere E-Commerce Fine Wine and Good Spirits site on the Azure WebSphere Commerce Version 8 platform. This platform provides additional security, system monitoring and resource scalability. Work includes production issue support, functional changes requested by the business and other commerce related updates that will be occurring during this timeframe.

Procured via DGS Contract #4400014600 – VENDOR: **OST, Inc.** – TERM: Six months for period 7/1/2021 through 12/31/2021 - **\$72,032.02 estimated cost.**

(5) **HP ProBook 650 G8 Laptops** – This procurement is for the normal laptop replacement cycle. The existing laptops have reached that age where the failure rate is increasing yearly. Desktop support is spending a significant amount of time dealing with these failures. We have been sporadically replacing them as they fail, or the users need more compute power then their existing laptop has. These laptops have sufficient compute power and a fast Solid State hard drive which should make their life span 4-5 years of normal usage.

Procured via DGS Contract #4400017908 – VENDOR: **HP, Inc. - \$206,850.00 estimated cost** (150 @ \$1,379.00 each).

(6) Legal Services Amendment - Duane Morris was hired as specialized outside counsel in 2018 to assist PLCB with the labor negotiations and bankruptcy matters related the former Philadelphia warehouse and transportation provider, XTL. Since that time, Duane Morris has continued to assist the PLCB Office of Chief Counsel with various litigation matters which are expected to continue. The Office of Chief Counsel also requires the specialized skill set of Duane Morris to manage the PLCB's IP Portfolio. This Amendment will extend the term of the contract through December 31, 2023 and will raise the maximum yearly spend to \$400,000.00.

At Board Member Negra's request, Executive Director Michael Demko further explained that the first four procurement actions are related to continued support of the existing Websphere-based website through the rest of this calendar year. The fifth agenda item is for replacement of 150 laptops within the organization and the sixth agenda item is to extend the legal services contract for outside counsel, under the direction of the Chief Counsel.

Inter-Agency Charges:

The FY 2020-21 billings total \$2.651 million for a \$204,954 (-7.2%) decrease as compared to last years \$2.856 million billings for FY 2019-20.

The Bureau of Financial Management and Analysis has reviewed these charges and determined that they are reasonable based on billing methodology and previous experience.

Executive Director Michael Demko noted that this Inter-Agency Charge is the estimated fourth quarter amount to be paid to the Auditor General.

OTHER ISSUES

Annual Oracle Support RenewalRob McCabe, Chief Information Officer

Provides technical and application support across the 23 different Oracle applications accessed by our user population of 5,500 different employees. This is required to keep all Oracle applications in good working order. This annual renew is from 6/1/21 to 5/31/22 and the total amount is \$2,578,870.22.

Chief Information Officer Rob McCabe explained that this expense is for the annual support of the Oracle on-premises software solution to ensure continuous functioning of the system. This on-premises solution will eventually be replaced by the cloud-based system that is the subject of the Oracle ERP project known as Project New Horizon. Mr. McCabe advised that his team carefully reviewed and validated the appropriateness of the charges for all the line items.

Board Member Negra asked for confirmation that no Board action is needed on this agenda item because the expense is part of the overall Oracle ERP project spend that has already been approved. Mr. McCabe confirmed that this is part of the already-approved project spend.

CITIZEN COMMENT/BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR

The teleconference moderator confirmed that there was one caller.

Sara Provencio stated that she is a resident of Erie County who has obtained various wine and spirits industry-related certifications and would like to begin hosting educational tastings of spirits. She asked how she can do this lawfully, as she is not a manufacturer of spirits, and does not want to have a bar or other physical location. Rather, for example, she wants to "pack up" five different vodkas and take them to a location where people want to learn about them and to experience them in a tasting-style environment. She has been unable to determine how to do this within applicable regulations.

Chairman Holden requested guidance from Chief Counsel Rodrigo Diaz, who responded that providing alcohol and charging a fee, even when that fee is intended to cover more than just the alcohol, is a violation of the Crimes Code and the Liquor Code because it is considered a "sale" of alcohol. Chief Counsel Diaz noted one way that Ms. Provencio could do this lawfully would be if she did not charge anything. That is, if she only provides alcohol to persons 21 years or older at no charge so people can learn about the alcohol, that would take care of the "sale" issue.

Another way she could do it is to request that people bring their own alcohol so that she would not be considered to be selling it to them. Chief Counsel Diaz stated that if Ms. Provencio would like more detailed information she can write to the Office of Chief Counsel, the email address for which is on the website, and the legal office will identify issues for her.

Ms. Provencio questioned if a catering or event-type permit would work given her set of facts.

Chief Counsel Diaz responded that a catering license does allow for the sale of alcohol off the normal licensed premises; however, the issue is that what she is referring to as a "catering license" is actually an off-premise catering permit that only retail licensees are eligible to obtain. Therefore, unless Ms. Provencio had a restaurant, she would not be able to obtain that off-premise permit.

Chief Counsel Diaz further explained that what PLCB calls "catering clubs" are essentially private clubs and a private individual would not be able to get the underlying license that would first be needed before an off-premises catering permit would be available. Chief Counsel Diaz referred Ms. Provencio to the Legal section of the PLCB website for answers to a lot of questions like this.

Board Member Negra asked Chief Counsel Diaz whether there is an option whereby Ms. Provencio could work with an existing licensee so that she could get paid by the licensee for educating their customers and the customers would then purchase the alcohol from the licensee. Chief Counsel Diaz stated it is possible to work with a manufacturer and do a wine or distillery exposition permit; however, in that case it would be a different entity selling the alcohol.

NEXT BOARD MEETING

The next meeting of the PLCB will be a formal meeting on Wednesday, June 23, 2021 beginning at 11:00 A.M. Prior to the public meeting, there will be an Executive Session to discuss matters of personnel and to engage in non-deliberative informational discussions, some of which are regarding actions and matters which have been approved at previous public meetings.

ADJOURNMENT

On a motion by Board Member Negra, seconded by Board Member Isenhour, the meeting	was adjourned
